Assistant City Manager Akbar Alikhan presented the following information: Friday May 28, 2021, is the deadline for sharing feedback in the "Vision and Guiding Principal surveys, which are available in English and Spanish. The next General Plan workshop is scheduled for June 3, 2021, at 6:00 p.m. There is a City Council Special meeting added to the schedule for June 14, 2021. Discussion included why the Consumer Price Index (CPI) as a metric for increasing fees; the Weed Abatement Program; a new fee for residential property inspections requests, and a plan to coordinate the Defensible Space Program efforts with the Water Wise Program to ease current conflicts.

The Land Development fees are scaled in relative to the project complexity. The specific variances in the fee schedules are due to caps on increases made in 2020 and the current fee schedule is intended to catch up the difference from last year's caps. The Fire Department uses a temporary employee for property inspections, thereby decreasing the labor costs, the Fire and Construction Inspection assumes approximately 15 minutes of the initial inspection and is listed on an Appendix to the Staff Report as part of the Cost of Service (COS) analysis for this fee.
