**Incident:** Brandishing of a Firearm, Criminal Threats

**Location:** Surfers Point, 399 Figueroa Street

**Date/Time Occurred:** 7-27-15 9:30pm

**Narrative:**

On the above date and time, the Ventura Police Department Command Center received a 911 call from Clay Allen, indicating he was the victim of a brandishing at Surfers Point in Ventura. Allen reported that two subjects confronted him while he was riding his bicycle at Surfers Point. One of the suspects pulled out a handgun and made threats to him. Allen was able to flee the area and contact the Ventura Police Command Center and provide the dispatcher a description and location of the suspects, as well as the vehicle they were associated with.

Officers arrived on scene and contacted the suspects in the vehicle. Officers were immediately confronted by several of the suspects' friends who approached from the beach. Officers quickly got the situation under control and detained (10) subjects.

Marco Medina and a male juvenile were found to be in possession of two handguns found in their vehicle. The male juvenile was positively identified as being the suspect in the brandishing and criminal threats. Medina was positively identified as being with the juvenile during the brandishing and threats.

The male juvenile was lodged at Juvenile Hall for possession of a concealed firearm, brandishing a firearm, criminal threats, and removing/altering the serial number of a firearm. Medina was booked at the Ventura County Jail for possession of a concealed firearm, and resisting arrest.

Two of the detained females were booked at the Ventura County Jail for resisting/obstructing officers, and a third male was booked for public intoxication.

No one was injured as a result of this incident.
