Narrative:

On March 12, 2015 at 5:55 AM, the Ventura Police Department Command Center received a 911 call from a female resident in the 1200 block of Via Arroyo reporting that her adult son was inside the residence and involved in a physical altercation with another adult male guest. That adult guest, later identified as Julio Delgado, had also physically assaulted the female caller before leaving the residence.

Two officers arrived on scene and encountered Delgado in the front yard of a neighboring residence down the street. Delgado was nude and displaying signs of being under the influence of hallucinating drugs. As one of the officers attempted to contact Delgado, he became combative and tried to hit the officer. Delgado was taken to the ground and a struggle ensued. As both officers were attempting to control Delgado and take him into custody, Delgado twice grabbed the second officer's handgun, which was in the holster. As he tried to remove the officer's handgun, the officer punched Delgado several times in the face. Delgado released his hold of the handgun and was taken into custody.

Delgado remained combative and had to be secured in leg restraints prior to being transported by ambulance to the hospital. After being medically cleared for minor injuries, he was booked into the Ventura County Jail for Felony Resisting Arrest and Attempting to Remove an Officer's Firearm.
