- **Public Comments Thus Far**

City Council Meeting
November 6, 2017

1st Public Hearing 10/23/17

- Communities of interest need to address
 - Income levels
 - Family types
 - Housing types – rent vs. own
 - Support for respecting Westside, Montalvo, Saticoy and Wells Corridor as distinct communities of interest

1st Public Hearing 10/23/17

- Encouraged City to:
 - Look at all under-represented groups to ensure diversity
 - Appoint a citizens committee to draw the district lines
- Inquired if the City is safe from litigation if it goes through the districting process



Community Meeting 10/26/17

- Saticoy should be respected as a community of interest; below and above the 126
- South Victoria Corridor and Montalvo areas are communities of interest:
 - Renters
 - Lower income levels

Community Meeting 10/26/17

- Montalvo area: consider using south of Telephone Road instead of 126 for boundaries
- North of Telephone Road has more businesses than residential but should be considered a community of interest

Community Meeting 10/26/17

- Group by more socioeconomic factors:
 - Higher in Hillsides and Beaches – where most of the City Councilmembers live
 - Renters
 - Income level

Community Meeting 10/26/17

- On the East Side, Hillside views and condos, while we may be near each other, not the same thinking or interests. Might not work for us to be in the same District.
- Remember our underserved communities
 - Rents are cheaper
 - High Latino population



Community Meeting 10/26/17

- **Make District lines that include a multitude of classes and ethnicity of residents**

Recommendation

- Hold a public hearing, receive public comment regarding the composition and criteria to establish the boundaries of the City's as yet-to-be-formed voting districts;
- Adopt the Resolution Establishing Criteria for Districts
- Close Public Hearing and Set December 4, 2017 for Next Public Hearing
