South African Film Wins Top Prize in Ventura Water's Water: Take I Online Short Film Festival

This year, 50 films were entered in the fifth annual Water: Take 1 Online Short Film Festival that calls attention to serious issues facing water resources locally and globally. Thousands of people worldwide watched and voted for their favorite films via the Water: Take 1 website, with a panel of jurors selecting the contest's winners. About 100 community members attended the festival's awards ceremony, presented by Ventura Water and held March 22 at the Channel Islands National Park Visitor Center.

The Grand Jury Award went to "Place of Sweet Waters," a film that highlights the water crisis facing Cape Town, South Africa. Cape Town is in the midst of its worst drought in two decades, yet millions of gallons of naturally occurring fresh water run under the city's streets, to be dumped straight into the sea, every day. This film's message and goal is that this water is reclaimed to help sustain Cape Town's booming - and increasingly water-stressed - population. Director Sven Harding won the \$1,500 cash prize and gave his acceptance speech via video.

Other Water: Take 1 awards and their winners this year were:

- Audience Choice Award: Paul Meehan and family, for the film, "Drought Wars: The Family Fights Back."
- Best Student Short Film: Beryl Allee, for her three short films, "Citizen of Your Watershed."




Visit Us at the Earth Day Eco Fest
